

INTRODUCTION

In fall of 2015 the City of Rock Hill engaged the services of SWT Design, landscape architects and park planners, to work with city staff and the community in assessing the condition and future needs of Oakhaven Park. The design process included two public workshop meetings and a final presentation to determine the needs of the community and review future renovation concepts.

Oakhaven Park is located at the intersection of Gilbert Avenue and Oakhaven Avenue on the northwest side of the city. The park is approximately 3.4 Acres in size and is

bordered by single family residences. The “Oak Trail” nature trail is adjacent to Oakhaven Park and is used by city residents. Park uses include tennis, picnics, playground and swings, unprogrammed open lawn, and walking loop trail.



CHAPTER ONE

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

EXISTING CONDITIONS

Oakhaven Park is comprised of two city-owned parcels, the east parcel of approximately 2.4 acres contains the existing developed park and the west parcel, approximately 1 acre in size, is undeveloped property to be added to the existing park in this master plan. The park includes one picnic shelter, four tennis courts, a playground with swings area, and a comfort station. The playground is primarily designed for children under the age of five. Parking for 15 vehicles is located along the north edge of the park on Oakhaven Avenue.

Three sides of the west parcel are heavily wooded and overgrown with invasive honeysuckle. In order for the woodland to become more of an amenity within the park, a honeysuckle remediation plan should be considered to clear out the thick understory and replaced with native Missouri woodland plants. This should be done with the utmost caution due to the approximately 25 feet of grade change that begins just inside the woodland and proceeds west to the creek.

CONCEPT DEVELOPMENT

PUBLIC PROCESS AND FORUM

The first public forum included a public input session held in the park on October 15, 2015. This session included discussion and review of concept bubble diagrams for general size and scale of potential components. A majority of input from those in attendance was focused on maintaining and improving existing park amenities and concerns about safety of an expanded park. Other feedback on October 15, and much of the online input, focused on enhancing and expanding the park amenities while keeping in mind the neighborhood scale and use of this park. Plans of the park program diagrams and a link to an online input form were posted on the city’s website for the community to review and provide comments. A summary of the comments received from the community is provided in the appendix.

On November 19, 2015, SWT Design presented a refined concept plan for Oakhaven Park based on city staff and resident comments received at the first input meeting and online. The concept was generally met with approval from city staff, commission members, and city residents. This concept was posted on the city website and is included on page 8. Feedback received regarding this concept is included in the Appendix.

The final master plan was presented at public forum #3 on December 16, 2015.



DEVELOPMENT OF CONCEPT

A master plan was developed based on input from city staff and the community and presented on November 19, 2015. The concept plan takes into account accessibility, safety, maximizing and centralizing amenities unique to the park, enhancing the visibility of the park from Gilbert Avenue and Oakhaven Drive, improving and expanding the playground, and expanding community user groups in the park. The following is a listing of program items for the park:


