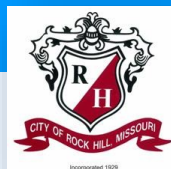

Individuals who sustained damage or losses due to the flooding between July 25 and July 28, 2022 in the City of St. Louis and St. Louis and St. Charles counties may now apply for FEMA disaster assistance online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or by calling FEMA's toll-free application line at 1-800-621-FEMA (3362) from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. Central Time, seven days a week.

Those affected by the flooding are encouraged to document losses, including photographing damage and retaining receipts. The faster Missourians register with FEMA, the faster they may be able to receive assistance.

Manchester Road Construction Update

As you have probably heard, the recent flooding along the Manchester project has delayed our anticipated opening of several portions of the project for a few weeks. After evaluating the potential impacts due to the flooding, our contractors and our construction team got together to discuss, more specifically, what those impacts would be.

Several delays, including unforeseen utility relocation and the recent flooding at Black Creek along Route 100, has impacted our anticipated opening of the bridge. The flooding required crews to do some clean up along the structure that had already been placed, and to redo some of the work to ensure that when the bridge is completed, it meets all the required standards for quality and safety. At this point, we anticipate Route 100 bridge over Black Creek, just west of Hanley, reopening in mid- to late-September.

The lane closures near Mary Road, for the pedestrian walkway under the roadway, are expected to continue through the end of October at this time.

We're told that the work on eastbound Manchester, just east of Hanley Road, by the Metropolitan Sewer district, is still on track to reopen before September.

Around the remainder of the project, crews continue to work on drainage, sidewalk, and entrances at various locations throughout the project from Kirkwood Rd to Big Bend.
