Tax Season Fraud Reminder

Tax season brings its own special scams. This is just a reminder that the IRS will not call you to say you owe taxes, just as the sheriff or police will not call to say you have a warrant. If you get a phone call that sounds too good to be true, or threatens you like this, it is probably a scam. The best thing is to just hang up. If you question its validity, you can contact them back at a number you know is valid, not the one they called you from.

Help stop crime by locking your car doors every night!

Remember to remove valuables and garage door openers from your car. Don't forget to take any keys or key fobs out of your vehicle. Keeping your outside lights on can help! If you keep your vehicle parked in your driveway, keep the outside lights on to deter any unwanted visitors coming onto your driveway and away from your car. The more lit up the neighborhood, the less likely vehicles will be burglarized, damaged, or even stolen! Report suspicious activity. For example, if you see someone pulling on car door handles call 911. Be sure to close your overhead garage door. Lock your interior garage door if possible. Officers are always out in the neighborhoods but we need your help to keep everyone safe. Be sure to report anything suspicious.
