City Administrator Jennifer Yackley has accepted the position of City Manager with the City of Olivette. Jennifer's last day with the City will be August 3, 2023.

Jennifer started with the City of Rock Hill in May 2008 as the Assistant to the City Administrator/City Clerk/City Planner. She was appointed City Administrator in July 2014.

In a note to staff, Jennifer said, "I will always be proud of the many accomplishments the City has achieved during my tenure including: building the new municipal complex, securing the future of the Uniformed Employee Pension Plan, reconstructing numerous city streets, and the many new homes and businesses that have come to Rock Hill. All of these

things would not have been possible without the hard work and dedication of city staff, elected officials, commissioners, and residents. Rock Hill is a hidden jewel in mid-St. Louis County; crafted by the generations who have come before, entrusted to those who live here now, and preserved for those who will call Rock Hill home in the future."

Manchester Road Update

Drivers who use North Berry from Route 100 (Manchester Road) should be prepared to take an alternate route the weekend of June 23, as crews will close access to the roadway.

Weather permitting, crews will close access from between North Berry and Manchester Road to the south starting Friday, June 23 at 7 p.m. During the closure, crews will be removing and replacing the pavement between North Berry and Manchester Road.

Manchester Road will remain open, but drivers will not be able to turn south onto North Berry or turn from North Berry onto Manchester Road during the closure. Access to and from Manchester Road to Blue Bell Lane and North Berry Road to the north of the intersection should not be impacted.

The roadway should reopen Sunday, June 25 by 7 p.m.
