HERE. On the ballot you will see the Alderperson election in your Ward, as well as the City's Proposition M. We have included information on Prop M below. In addition to the Rock Hill Prop M, St. Louis County has Prop M on the ballot as well. St. Louis County is allowing you to vote at any polling place again for this election and will be updating the Line Tracker so you can find the best time to go. 

### New Ward Map



**New Ward Map** The Board of Aldermen approved a new ward map for the city on November 15, 2022. The city's wards are reviewed after the U.S. Census and adjusted as necessary to keep the population balanced between the wards. The results from the 2020 Census showed that the old Ward Two had approximately 600 fewer residents than Wards One and Three. In order to balance the populations of the wards, the Ward Two footprint grew to include areas from Ward One and Ward Three resulting in equal populations in Wards One and Three and increasing Ward Two's population.

### Rock Hill Police Department



With tax season in progress, the Rock Hill Police Department wants to remind everyone of common IRS/Tax Return scams.

Remember the IRS will never:

- Call or demand immediate payment on the phone.
- Call about taxes owed without first mailing you several statements.
- Email you to verify your identity by asking for personal and financial information.
- Demand that you pay taxes without giving you an opportunity to appeal/dispute the amount you owe.
- Require specific payments from your taxes (such as prepaid cards and gift cards).
- Ask for a credit or debit card number through the phone or email.
- Threaten to contact law enforcement to have you arrested for not paying.

Report Scams:

- Contact TIGTA to report the call. Use their "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" webpage or call 800-366-4484.
- Report it to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov.
- Contact the Rock Hill Police Department at 314-962-6600.

If you know you owe taxes or think you may owe taxes: Call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS employees can help you. The General Municipal Election will be on April 4. Prop M will be on the ballot. For a copy of other items on the ballot or information about the election, click here.



During the statewide election of November 2022, Missouri voters approved an amendment to the state's constitution, which made the use and sale of recreational (adult use) marijuana legal in Missouri for adults over the age of 21.

The Rock Hill Board of Alderman voted to put a question regarding the additional 3% sales tax on recreational marijuana on the ballot for the April 4 municipal elections. Additionally, the amendment placed a 6% state sales tax on purchases of

recreational marijuana and authorized local governments to add a 3% sales tax



Currently, more than 100 Missouri municipalities have a recreational marijuana sales tax question on the April ballot, including Webster Groves, Shrewsbury, Glendale and St. Louis County.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is recreational marijuana? In November 2022, Missouri voters passed a constitutional amendment allowing the sale and use of marijuana for personal use for those ages 21 and over.

Who pays the recreational marijuana sales tax? Only people purchasing recreational marijuana in Rock Hill at a state-licensed store would pay the 3% city sales tax.

#### How would the City spend the money?

Any revenues from a recreational marijuana tax would go into the city's General Fund. This fund allows the City the flexibility to put the money into city services needed most as they can change year to year.

#### How many dispensaries are in Rock Hill?

Greenlight Dispensary is scheduled to open this spring and will be the first facility selling medicinal marijuana and recreational marijuana in Rock Hill.

When does recreational marijuana take effect? Licensed dispensaries began selling recreational marijuana as early as February 6th.


