


A View from the Hill





New Ward Map The Board of Aldermen approved a new ward map for the city on November 15, 2022. The city's wards are reviewed after the U.S. Census and adjusted as necessary to keep the population balanced between the wards. The results from the 2020 Census showed that the old Ward Two had approximately 600 fewer residents than Wards One and Three. In order to balance the populations of the wards, the Ward Two footprint grew to include areas from Ward One and Ward Three resulting in equal populations in Wards One and Three and increasing Ward Two's population.

December 6 Opening of candidate filing (8:00 a.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

December 27 Closing of candidate filing (5:00 p.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

January 24 Closing for receiving certification of election forms (5:00 p.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

February 21 Absentee voting with an excuse opens (8:00 a.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

March 8 Last day to register to vote (5:00 p.m.) in the April 4th General Municipal Election.

March 21 No-excuse in-person absentee voting opens (8:00 a.m.) for the April 4th

General Municipal Election. March 22 Last day to apply for a mailed absentee ballot (5:00 p.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

March 24 Last day to file as a write-in candidate (5:00 p.m.) for the April 4th General Municipal Election.

April I Board of Elections office open for absentee voting (9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.) in the

February 7th Bond Election.* April 3 Last day for voting an absentee ballot in person at the Board of Elections (5:00 p.m.) for the February 7th Bond Election.

April 4 ELECTION DAY, Polls open from 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

Oak Trail Project

The City of Rock Hill has received a grant from the Missouri Department of Conservation to remove the invasive species from Oak Trail Park.

WHY •

Invasive species are covering much of Oak Trail Park. Invasive species are capable of causing the extinction of native plants and animals.

WHO •

The City is working with Native Landscape Solutions. They have the staff, experience and equipment needed to remove the invasive species.

WHEN •

Native Landscape Solutions plans to remove the honeysuckle this winter while it is dormant. They will be back in the spring to plant native seeds.

WASTE CONNECTIONS WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY:

With the anticipated frigid and wintery weather forecast for our winter months, Waste
Connections would like to roll out our plan to our Municipal customers in case of delayed starts or
any suspended services due to extreme weather.

In the event of sub-zero temperatures, dangerous wind chills, or large amounts of accumulative snow our management team will make a decision to either delay start of service or suspend service entirely.

DELAYED SERVICE:

Our drivers typically prepare their day around 5 am with most cities having a 6:30 to 7:00 am curfew start time. If management decides to delay our start there will be an anticipated new start time of 8 AM or later. This will be communicated to each city first thing that morning via email.

SUSPENDED SERVICE:

If the drivers' safety is at risk, management will suspend service for that day only unless the reason warrants additional days, which will be determined each day after that. In the event of one day of suspended service, the remainder of the week will be treated as a rolling week and each service day will roll through Saturday and be completed. In the event that more than one day is affected, a determination will be made at that time and emails will be sent to cities with the remainder of the week's plan.

CUSTOMER SERVICE:

Our customer service department will add a recorded message regarding the situation for the day. If service is delayed or suspended please ask your residents to download the Waste Connections mobile app to find out your collection schedule. The free app is available for download on Apple and Android devices.
