JOIN THE ROCK HILL FIRE DEPARTMENT ON **WEDNESDAY**, **NOVEMBER 8 AT 6:00 PM** AS WE PUT OUR NEW FIRE TRUCK INTO SERVICE. HOT DOGS AND FIRE-THEMED KIDS ACTIVITIES PROVIDED, ALONG WITH THE OPPORTUNITY TO CHEER ON THE FIREFIGHTERS AS THEY "PUSH-IN" THE FIRE TRUCK.

HISTORY: BEGINNING IN THE 1800S, AFTER CREWS RETURNED FROM A CALL ON HORSE-DRAWN EQUIPMENT, THE ANIMALS WERE UNABLE TO BACK INTO THE STATION, REQUIRING MEMBERS TO DETACH THE HORSES AND PUSH THE EQUIPMENT INTO THE BAY. OVER TIME, WITH THE INVENTION AND ADOPTION OF MOTORIZED APPARATUS, THE NEED TO MANUALLY MOVE THE EQUIPMENT WAS GONE.

HOWEVER, THE LEGACY OF THE PUSH-IN WAS SECURED.




- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home.



Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 metre) around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

FACTS

- The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.
- (!) Most cooking fires in the home involve the kitchen stove.

Open Space STL, alongside our partners from Great Rivers Greenway, MSD Project Clear, the River des Peres Watershed Coalition, St. Louis County Parks, and Earthways Center, is elated to host the annual River des Peres Trash Bash cleanup of the watershed and surrounding areas. Through coordinated efforts, we annually host the #ConfluenceTrashBash and #RiverdesPeresTrashBash.
